This Indenture made this 5<sup>th</sup> day of March one thousand eight hundred and five between James Buford and Betty his wife of the County of Bourbon and State of Kentucky of the one part and Robert Groddy of the County of Campbell and State of Virginia of the other part Witnesseth that the said James Buford for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred pounds in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath bargained sold and confirmed and delivered unto the said Robert Groddy his heirs and assigns forever three lots or parcels of ground in the town of New London and known in a plan of the Town by the figures following viz, N. 6. being one half acre on which stands a large two story house called Meads tavern, N. 8. being one half acre and lying back of the lot aforesaid, and also three acres of ground being a part of the lot N. 45. which originally contained 5 acres it being that part of said lot not conveyed by me to His Aid. To have and to hold the said three lots or parcels of ground with all their appurtenances thereunto belonging unto the said Robert Groddy his heirs and assigns forever; and the said James Buford and Betty his wife for themselves their heirs and assigns doth warrant and defend the said lots and parcels of land against themselves their heirs and assigns and against every other person or


